Presidents Report

2022-23 has been one of the biggest years yet for the ACT Men's and Mixed Netball Association (ACTMMNA) and has seen some significant achievements ticked off the to-do list.

This year has also held special significance for me as the President of this organisation, as it is my final year leading this amazing and spirited bunch of netballers.

Following some tough decisions about the composition of the ACT representative teams for the 2023 National Championships in Perth, the ACTMMNA Committee settled on two teams, consolidating in a men's reserves and mixed reserves team. Both teams performed incredibly strongly at the competition, solidifying the ACT's reputation as a small but talented force to be reckoned with.

The mixed team finished the competition as minor premiers and third overall in their division while the men's team reached not only the finals for the first time, but claimed the Association's first ever men's reserves spot in the grand final, ultimately finishing in second position overall. Both teams exhibited the Griffins spirit on and off the court and their respective success is a testament to the talented coaching staff who led them to success over the week of the tournament.

The exciting men's division continued in the Netball ACT HCF State League competition with five teams fighting for the annual trophy. This competition has become a crucial flank of the offering of men's netball in the ACT and is proving to be an exciting and integrated feature of the overall netball offering in Canberra.

In a major achievement for the Association, 2023 saw ACTMMNA host our first Emerging Griffins Academy, led by Academy Coach Lauren Grimes. The program took place over several weekends and provided boys under 15 with the opportunity to connect with other young male netballers while having a professionally coached environment to develop their netball skills.

The Academy program paved the way for the first ever boys only invitational division as part of the ACT Junior Championships competition which was held in June 2023. Two teams of boys participated in the invitational division and played three games over two days with large crowds watching on in breaks from the girls competition. This moment is a significant one for ACTMMNA. It not only realises a goal that ACTMMNA Committees have aspired toward for some years, but also proved that the future of men's netball in the ACT is bright.

Plans are underway for ACT representative team trials for the championships to be held in Brisbane. We hope that the ACT can boost it's number of teams once again and include youth teams in the compliment that will compete for the 2024 trophies.

I would like to thank the Committee which started small following the previous AGM but grew steadily over the year. This dedicated and enthusiastic group of volunteers are the lifeblood of the ACT Men's and Mixed Netball Association. They contribute countless hours of time to the growth and success of the Association and I couldn't have done it without them.

This moment marks a bitter-sweet one for me. The last six years as President and eight years as part of the ACTMMNA Committee have been incredibly rewarding and enriching. I have not only been able to work with an incredible team over the years to grow men's and mixed netball in the ACT but have made so many new friends along the way. But, I do believe that change in leadership is crucial to the ongoing success of organisations like this as therefore will be stepping down as the President at this AGM. I do so proud of what we have been able to achieve together over the last few challenging years.

I have truly loved my time in this role. I have loved being a Griff and can't wait to see what is next for this exciting group of netballers who wear the yellow and blue.
